

2022 Proxy Vote Instructions

Elect **Eight** Directors to Serve on the Board

Overview

As was recently announced, the Boston Church will hold its annual meeting of the members on December 5th, 2022, at 6:30pm via a Zoom call. The purpose of the meeting will be to elect Eight directors to the church's board.

Because of the difficulty of getting the entire church together on Zoom to conduct this vote, the Church is providing members the opportunity to vote by electronic proxy.

Voting

We previously posted and emailed a handout on behalf of the board that described the election process and gave a background for each of our nominees. The candidates have been nominated from among the membership, commended by the local regional leadership and the elders, and interviewed by the current board. They are being put forth today as outstanding candidates to serve a three-year term on the board. **The board needs EIGHT new directors today, and they hope that you will vote for all Eight.**

The purpose of the proxy vote is to allow you to vote for the nominated directors without being present at the December 5th meeting.

Let's quickly go through the ballot together.

- This is not a contest or political vote where only one candidate will win; **we need 8 winners today!** So, we'd encourage you to vote for all of the nominees.
- EVERY member of the church should vote, both husband and wife, single, campus and teen members. We need as many votes from the members as we can get.
- Only members of the Boston Church of Christ can vote.
- Please enter your name and address on the form as this is required by law for a proxy vote.
- Please complete a ballot even if you decide not to vote for any directors. Your ballot will be counted towards our quorum requirement.
- You may not vote for more than Eight candidates, so only check Eight boxes.
- Finally, click 'Submit' at the bottom of the page. This will authorize a representative of the current board to cast your vote as you have indicated.
